CHAPTER 171

YELLOW FEVER AND INFECTIOUS DISEASES (IMMUNISATION) LAW

to make provision for the compulsory immunisation of persons against yellow fever and other infectious diseases.

may be cited as the Yellow Fever and Infectious Diseases (Immunisation)

Section 1.

child means a person who is or who appears to be of the age of fourteen years

adult means a person who is or who appears to be under the age of fourteen

12. Provision for application of this Law to infectious diseases

If the Governor shall by order so declare, the provisions of this Law shall apply *mutatis mutandis* in relation to any disease specified in the order, being an infectious disease as defined in the Public Health Law, as they apply in relation to yellow fever.
